HMI Visit

Following the HMI visit to school on 24th January 2019 we are pleased to inform you that Senior Leaders and Governors are taking effective action to tackle the areas requiring improvement identified in the inspection in January 2018.

Main Findings

- ◆ School improvement plans have been implemented with purpose and vigour.
- ◆ Changes to the teaching of Maths and Reading have led to a more coherent curriculum. This important development is supporting pupils' learning.
- ◆ Pupils are engaged by a more purposeful approach to teaching and interesting resources.
- ◆ Pace and productivity in lessons have improved and pupils read more widely and know a greater range of methods to solve mathematical problems.
- ◆ Teachers' expectations of pupils have increased.
- ◆ Pupils' attitudes to learning are improving.

The staff, Governors and pupils have worked hard on improving the quality of teaching and learning and will continue this drive for improvement with pace and vigour to ensure the best outcomes for the children at Burlington.

I would like to thank all the staff, Governors, parents and other stakeholders for their hard work and commitment to the children of Burlington.
