The activities that the children completed were very broad, such as; making an electrical musical instrument using recycled materials, learning how to weld using a welding stimulator, wearing a rucksack that a visually impaired person could wear that helps you to navigate and a fossil finding task.

They chatted with a company about the equipment that is needed to make pipes and a company that makes safety equipment for cars.
