This week we have discussed how Heathrow airport is hoping to expand to create a third runway. This would mean a lot more flights would fly to and from what is already the largest airport in the UK. Many campaigners have warned the project with caused 30 years of misery and long term damage. The plans include diverting the M25, diverting rivers, moving roads and losing a village of 721 homes.

Supporters of the new runway have said it would help to reduce fares of tickets, lead to fewer delays and allow travel to daily destinations.

Questions to discuss at home:

- Is the expansion a good idea? Why?
- What impact will there be on the environment? Why?
