

What do Governors do?

Governors play an important role in the leadership and management of the school and are responsible for making sure that the school is run well. This includes ensuring that the school has a clear vision, ethos and strategic direction, that every child has access to good quality education and the opportunity to reach their full potential and that the school's money is well spent.

As part of this, Governors regularly visit the school. During this term these visits have included:

- meeting with the Headteacher to keep up-to-date on what's happening at school
- attending meetings of the full Governing Body, the Teaching and Achievement Committee and the Staffing and Resources Committee
- undertaking learning walks to see how school improvement targets are being implemented
- seeing children learning in the classroom
- reviewing policies, performance data and budgets
- supporting concerts and other events

Governors have also attended two training sessions conducted by the Local Authority on readiness for Ofsted and supporting and challenging the school.

Class Dojo

Reading for Pleasure

This term the school has been promoting reading for pleasure. This has included creating reading displays and reading areas in classrooms and around the school, purchasing new books, giving pupils opportunities to read for pleasure and sharing books in assemblies. At our December meeting, Governors were given a tour of the school to see the reading displays and areas and Mr. Hardwick (Reading Co-ordinator) spoke to us about reading for pleasure is being promoted and encouraged throughout the school. Parent Questionnaires

As Governors we conduct a parent questionnaire at least annually to gather your views on different aspects of the school. This has now been updated so that questions are in line with the new Ofsted questions. Our last questionnaire was conducted during the Autumn Term parent evenings. The feedback showed that 96.8% of parents agreed/strongly agreed that their child was happy at Burlington and 97.56% agreed/strongly agreed that their child felt safe at the school.

However, 27.28% of parents said that they did not know what the Governing Body does or how to get in touch with us. We hope that the termly Governor Newsletter will help you to better understand our role and what we do.

The school has also looked at how it deals effectively with bullying as a result of your feedback. Bullying is defined as behaviour that is repeated and intended to hurt someone either physically or emotionally. However, bullying is a word that is often used when children just fall out with one another. Children are made aware of exactly what bullying is and that this is unacceptable and will not be tolerated. If your child does fall out with another child and you are concerned about this then please contact their class teacher or Mrs Robson (the school's Pastoral Support Advisor) so that these issues can be addressed.
