Science: Electricity

This week, as scientists, we are going to be discovering information about Electricity! This week we will be asking children to carry out research about Electricity. Their task, to find out as much information as possible in order to create a fact file based on what they have learnt.

History: Titanic

This week, we are going to be investigating who was to blame for the Titanic disaster. We will look at the key individuals who may have led to the disaster and the sources containing evidence. For Your task we would like you to first of all research to find out who the main culprits were before then continuing on to create a small piece of writing explaining who you believe was to blame for the incident.

English: We are beginning our unit on explanation texts now.
