Subject: Geography - Local Area

As geographers, we will explore the difference between human and physical features. We will also compare the human and physical features of London and Bridlington.

As part of our wider Geographical learning, we will continue to study and learn about different map skills, as well as the different continents and oceans of the world.

Subject: PSHE - Celebrating Difference

We will adopt a mindful approach as we reflect on our community. In particular, we will be exploring what makes our community diverse, considering the different skills and values that people bring to the Burlington community.

Subject: Science - Light

As scientists, we will recognise that we need light in order to see things, that light from the sun can be dangerous and that there are ways to protect our eyes. Also, we will explore how light is reflected from surfaces and that shadows are formed when the light from a light source is blocked by a solid object.

Subject: RE - Remembering

As theologians, we will evaluate how personal artefacts are used to commemorate Remembrance Day and how religious people reflect on this occasion in relation to their faith. We will also explore and evaluate the customs of Christmas.



Subject: Computing - Online Safety

We will discuss what makes a safe password, how to keep passwords safe and the consequences of giving your passwords away. We will then explore how the internet can be used to help us to communicate effectively. Finally, we will examine how a blog can be used to help us communicate with a wider audience.

Subject: Art -David Hockney and Landscapes

As artists, we will complete an artist study on David Hockney. Then from this, we will develop our sketching and painting skills to produce a piece of art based on Hockney's work.
