

## **Remote Learning Provision**

During this term Governors have especially focussed on looking at the school's strategy and plans for delivering remote education to pupils at home due to COVID-19 and if this provision met the expectations outlined in guidance issued by the Department of Education.

The school's Remote Learning Leader provided reports and updates for Governors to answer questions about our remote learning provision. These questions included:

- Has the school been able to switch quickly and efficiently to online learning?
- Are pupils being provided with 4 hours remote learning a day in line with Department of Education expectations?
- Does online learning provision include both recorded or live direct teaching time and time for pupils to complete tasks independently?
- How are pupils and staff supported, educated and encouraged to stay safe and behave online?
- How are we supporting our pupils and their families to engage with the online learning provided?
- How are pupils who are unable to access online learning supported?

The Ofsted Remote Monitoring Inspection conducted on 27<sup>th</sup>/28<sup>th</sup> January commented that: *Governors are checking that leaders are taking appropriate action to ensure that pupils are receiving an education.* 

Thank you to all the parents who completed the recent remote learning survey. Overall, the results of this were positive with over 75% of parents saying that they were happy with the lockdown learning provided by the school. The school is however aware that they need to continue to work on some areas such as the quality of IT provision, communication between parents and teachers and volume of work. Governors will be involved in monitoring the progress made in addressing these areas.

Thanks also must go to the staff for all their hard work in ensuring that pupils have received good quality education during lockdown and year group isolations.
