

This Week's Useful Vocabulary

Collaborative – Produced by or involving two or more people or groups working together. The 'collaborative information system was being used by the scientists at CERN.

Network – A number of computers connected together so they can share information. The decision to put the Web in the public in 1993 allowed the network to become what it is today. Online – Using the Internet. Talk about some of the devices we use to go online.

Proposed – Suggested as a possible plan or action for people to consider. Tim Berners-Lee, a 37-year-old computer scientist from London, proposed a system of pages of information (now known as websites).

Public domain – Available for everyone to see or know about. The decision to put the Web in the public domain in 1993 allowed the network to become what it is today.

Website - A page or group of connected pages on the World Wide Web about a particular subject, published by a single person or organisation. Can you list some of the main users of websites?
