





Within the next ten years, people may be able to travel between London and Sydney in just two hours by journeying through space on a sub-orbital flight. The current length of a traditional flight between London, UK, and Sydney, Australia, is at least 20-22 hours and usually entails a stop-off to refuel along the way. <u>This Week's Useful Vocabulary</u>

Altitude – Height above sea level. A sub-orbital flight involves launching a spacecraft to an altitude above the Karman line (the boundary of space).

Commercial – Making or intended to make a profit. BA commercial flight 22hr 50min.

Microgravity - Very weak gravity, especially in a spacecraft orbiting the earth. Period of microgravity in between launch and re-entry.

Sub-orbital – Having a flight path that is less than one complete orbit of the earth. Do you imagine you would like to travel on a sub-orbital craft?

Traditional – Having existed for a long time without changing. The current length of a traditional flight between London, UK, and Sydney, Australia, is at least 20-22 hours.

Transformed – Changed or converted. Travel has transformed the way we live our lives.

Bikeability

Reminder to the selected pupils that Bikeability will be taking place on the 29th & 30th June. Please remember to check your child's bicycle;

Wheels and tyres: tyres pumped up, wheel nuts tight, wheels should spin freely. Brakes: testing the front and back brakes separately, try to push the bike back and forth it shouldn't move (test a few times with each brake). Check brake lever doesn't hit handlebars.

Handlebars: hold front wheel between legs and try to twist handlebars - they shouldn't move.

Bike fit and saddle: your child should be able to comfortably stand over the bike. Adjust the saddle so that they can just touch the floor and there is only a slight bend when their foot is at the bottom of the pedal stroke.
