London - Year 6



On 20th and 27th September, pupils from school travelled down to London for their 'Kip on a Ship' experience. In Hull, we met Mark, our volunteer guide from The Hull Children's University, who led our experience. After a 2½ train ride to London Kings Cross (we looked out for Harry Potter), we took the tube to London Bridge and to the HMS Belfast, our 'hotel' for the night. After lunch, we walked along the River Thames to the Lyceum Theatre where we were amazed by the incredible Lion King performance. We then took a tube back to the HMS Belfast where we had tea, our ship safety talk and the evening's activities of touring the boat and mug making based on what we had learnt about the navy.

It was an early start the next morning for breakfast and then we set off to tour London, visit a gift shop and arrive in time for our boat cruise along the Thames. We learnt a lot about London and its history and waved to people on the bridges above (a tradition, we were told, that would bring us good luck). More walking and we visited the Horse Guards before going to the Houses of Parliament, where we had a tour of the building (including where Henry VIII used to live), stood between the actual seat benches of the House of Commons and the House of Lords (for one group; the other watched the House of Lords in session) and then role-played an activity of making a new law. It was an amazing experience and we visited places few people get to visit, creating, we hope, inspiring memories for a lifetime.

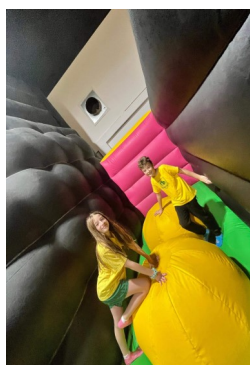
