











































## **Teddy Bear Stall - Christmas Fair**

**Landscape** – All the visible features of an area of land. It was located in a dip in the landscape and was always a very popular photographic subject.

**Legacy** – A situation that has developed as a result of past actions and decisions. Can you come up with any ways that the tree's legacy can be remembered?

**Sentimental value** – The value of something based on personal or emotional associations rather than material worth. Talk about how other things, such as toys or animals, can also hold a lot of meaning to us, or 'sentimental value'.

10 year olds who read for enjoyment are on average 1.3 years ahead of non-reading peers. [Sources: The Reading Agency, National Literary


