## In the news this week

A new robot called Digit, designed to be human-like and that is capable of lifting and moving items, is being tested in warehouses of the online retailer, Amazon. The robot is in its first few weeks of trials at Amazon's facility in Seattle, USA, as the company ries to improve automation in its processes. To begin with, the robot is being taught to pick up and move empty boxes to ensure that they are ready for reuse. The yellow boxes, or totes, are used throughout the company's fulfilment process.

#### This weeks useful vocabulary

Automation – The use of machines and computers that can operate without needing humans. The robot is in its first few weeks of trials at Amazon's facility in Seattle, USA, as the company tries to improve automation in its process.

Fulfilment – The process of taking an order and sending a product to a customer. The yellow boxes, or totes, are used throughout the company's fulfilment process.

Sophisticated – More advanced or complex. The robot is not yet able to perform more sophisticated tasks.

Terrain –An area or type of land. This key feature,

which gives the robot the ability to walk over different terrains and up steps as found in human environments, could be particularly useful for Amazon.

Tate – A large strong bag with two handles. The yellow boxes, or totes, are used throughout the company's fulfilment process.

Trialled – Test something to assess its suitability or performance. Digit is a 175cm-tall robot created by Agility Robotics that is being trialled at some of Amazon's warehouses.
