Community centres, libraries, businesses, and churches across the UK have been set up as free warm spaces to help provide warmth and companionship during the winter months. With cold weather continuing, charities and campaign groups are concerned that households face higher energy bills than last year. More than 12,000 warm banks were used by millions of Britons last winter in response to rising energy prices that worsened the UK's cost of living crisis. The scheme was set up by local councils, charities, and partner organisations.

Over the last few weeks, Year 3 have visited Bridlington Spa to take part in the 'Ambassadors of Bridlington' challenge. During the visit, pupils interviewed members of the public about the local area, its features and how it could be developed further. They were also able to research famous local people, identifying why they represent Bridlington. The pupils showed fantastic behaviour throughout the day and were a credit to Burlington Junior School. A big thank you to the Hull Children's University staff who organised and delivered this experience.



Super Science Day - Year 6

On Thursday, the Year 6's visited Headlands for a Super Science day. We first found out about how materials burnt (using the Bunsen burners - very exciting!) over time, using measuring and timing skills. Next we experimented with different materials to find out how acid or alkali were on the ph scale. We also experimented with lights and mirrors to complete given challenges - this fitted in really well with our current science topic on light. Finally we found out how much power we could get from lemons, oranges and potatoes. It is surprising how powerful they are. It was a very enjoyable morning and it was great to get an experience of science in a secondary school.
