

## This weeks useful vocabulary

**Devastation -** Great destruction or damage. Predicting a volcanic eruption, which can cause huge devastation to its surrounding area, is hard.

**Eruption -** When lava, steam and ash explode/burst from a volcano. Scientists monitoring a volcano in Iceland have said an eruption could happen.

**Evacuation -** Moving people from a dangerous place to somewhere safe. An underground river of magma led to the evacuation of 4,000 people from the town of Grindavik and Iceland has declared a state of emergency.



**Inhabitants -** The people that live in a particular place. Grindavik, a town in Iceland with about 4,000 inhabitants, is roughly 2 miles from where the earthquake activity has been recorded.

**Magma -** Hot liquid rock found just below the surface of the Earth. The Fagradalsfjall volcano in Iceland has been causing a series of earthquakes and an underground river of magma was discovered in October.

**Unpredictable –** Likely to change suddenly and without reason. Like many unpredictable situations that can make life difficult, a lot of resilience and planning Ahead can help to ensure safety and a positive outcome.

## Lego STEM Workshop - Year 5


