## In the news this week



A new artwork, from the mysterious street artist Banksy, appeared in North London overnight in March. The artwork shows green paint sprayed on a wall behind a cut-back tree to look like greenery, with a stencil of a person holding a spray can next to it. In the days following its creation, it was covered with plastic and surrounded by wooden boards to protect it. The local council, Islington, has added a frame around the site, which has plastic panels to allow people to view the artwork, whilst ensuring its protection.

## This weeks useful vocabulary

**Consequences** - A result or repercussion of certain behavior, typically unpleasant. There are strict **consequences** for those who do it.

**Definition** - A statement that explains the meaning of something. Share your own definition of art and what it means to you.

**Graffiti** - Words or drawings made in public places. It can be purely artistic, funny or contain a political meaning. Is there any **graffiti** in your local area?

**Illegal** - It is against the law. In most places, it is **illegal**.

**Mural** - A piece of artwork that is created or applied directly onto a wall. To ensure the **mural** was protected, the owners of the building erected wooden boards around the painting.

## Murton Park - Year 4

Year 4 have been on their trip to Murton park this week. It is a mock Roman fort and really brought their history learning about Romans to life. They made oil lamps from clay, joined the roman army using Latin to complete the application, they trained- to use a javelin, sword and shield- as well as marching (including making formations). It was a great day for all.



## Science at Bridlington School - Year 5

After having been invited to Bridlington school during Science week, we were invited back to join in some science lessons in their labs. On Friday afternoon Class 10 went to Bridlington School for some work on chemical reactions. This was brilliant as it fit with our previous learning on reversible and irreversible changes perfectly.

The children got to work in a proper science lab and access equipment and experiments that we are not able to use at our primary setting. Huge thanks to Miss Tagg at Bridlington school who gave up her free time to plan and support our pupils through this session.

We were all very excited!

Each of the Year 5 classes will get this experience over the coming weeks.

The results following Tuesday's competition will be published next week.

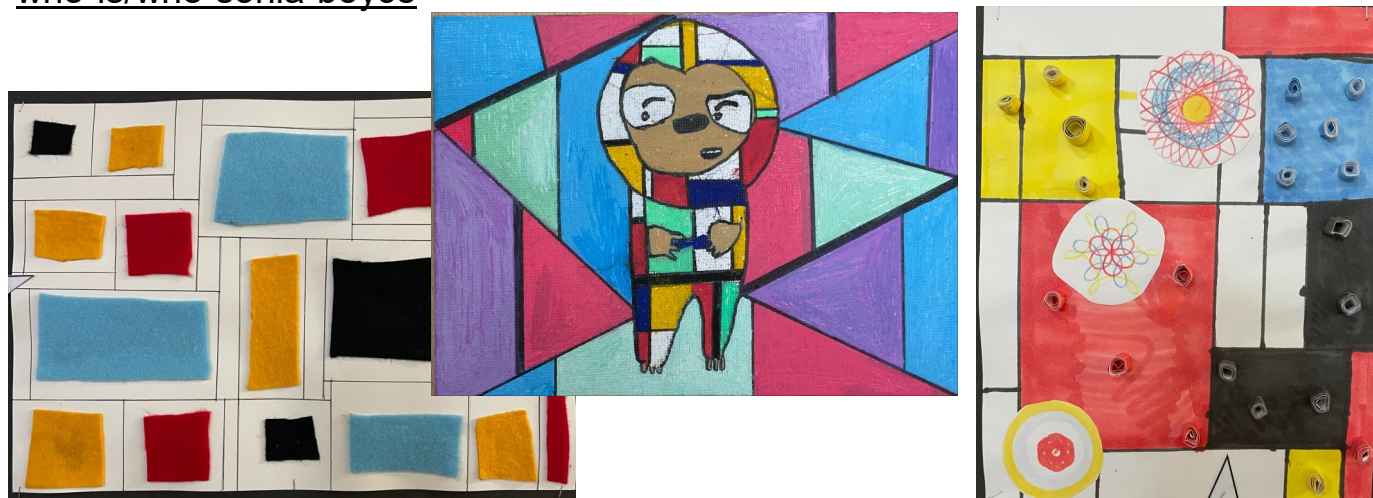


## Artist Focus

This is open to all SEND parents/carers and you do not need to be known to the 0-25 SEND Team or have an EHCP.

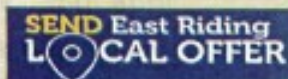

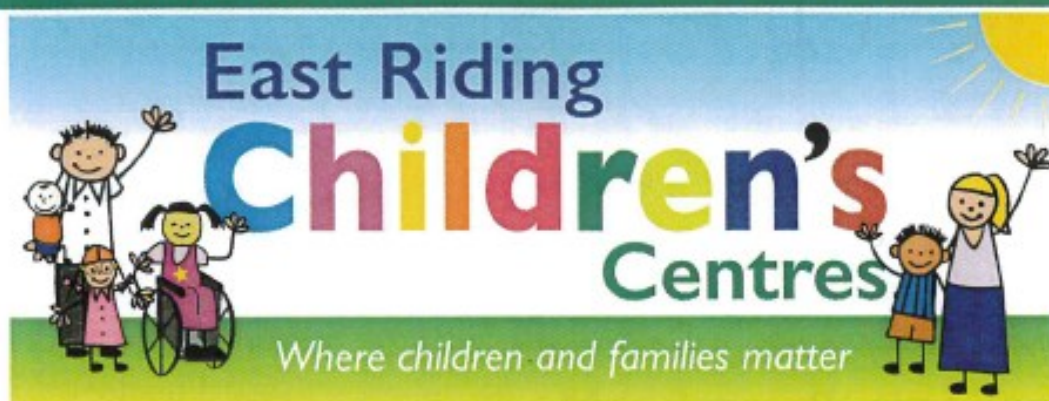
