In the news this week

Cambridge University has returned four spears to the descendants of an indigenous community in Australia, who crafted them. The four aboriginal spears are all that remain of the forty or so that British explorer, James Cook, and his team took from the Gweagal people more than 250 years ago. On their arrival in Australia in 1770, they became the first known Europeans to reach the country's east coast.

This weeks useful vocabulary

Aboriginal – Relating to the earliest known inhabitants of a region. The four aboriginal spears are all that remain of the forty or so that British explorer, James Cook, and his team look from the Gweagal people.

Ancestors – The people from whom we have descended, who lived a long time ago. 'They are an important connection to our past, our traditions, and cultural practices, and to our ancestors.'

Clan – A group of people related by blood, marriage or common interest. The four wooden spears are considered very special by the Aboriginal clan, the Gweagals.

Encounter – An unexpected meeting. Following the less than friendly encounter, the British crew took forty of their spears.

Heirloom – A special object that has been in a family for a long time and is passed down from generation to generation. Do you know what an heirloom is?

Indigenous – Having always lived in a place. Cambridge University has returned four spears to the descendants of an indigenous community in Australia.
