Categories – A class or group of things. The winners of the categories receive cash prizes, a trip to London and their photos displayed in the Natural History Museum.

Conservation – The protection of wildlife and the environment. This year the competition has also introduced a new Impact Award to recognise conservation successes and stories of hope.

Exhibition – A display of artwork or other items of interest to the public. The competition has become one of the world’s most prestigious photography awards, with an exhibition seen by millions!

Prestigious – Something that is respected or admired by people. The competition has become one of the world’s most prestigious photography awards.

Shortlist – A small group of things, picked from many as they are the best or most suitable. The Wildlife Photographer of the Year shortlist has recently been announced.
