Dear Parents/Carers,

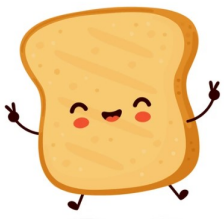
I am writing to inform you that Mrs Beckett is currently off work and that, in her absence, Mrs Kirby will be acting Headteacher.

Asda will donate a percentage of your shop to your chosen school each time you shop and scan.

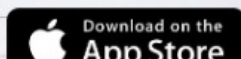

The UK's first teacherless classroom, using AI (artificial intelligence) instead of human teachers, has opened. David Game College, a school in London, began its new course for twenty GCSE pupils in September. The pupils will learn using both AI platforms on their computers and VR (virtual reality) headsets.

Artificial intelligence - A type of technology that enables computers or machines to think and learn almost like human beings. Twenty 15 and 16-year-old pupils will join the UK's first ever teacherless classroom this year, with AI (artificial intelligence) leading the way!

Flaws - Mistakes, weaknesses or imperfections in something or someone. A teacher doesn't really know your flaws because he has so many students.

GCSE - Exams that students take at the end of secondary school, usually aged around 16. GCSE stands for *General Certificate of Secondary Education*.

Perform - How well or how poorly someone does when taking an exam. Do you think the pupils using the AI classroom for their GCSE's will perform as well in their exams as pupils with teachers?

Requirement - A rule or condition that must be met. Do you think there should be an age requirement?

Virtual reality - A technology that uses sounds and images to create a computer-generated world that users can interact with as if it were real. The pupils will learn using both AI platforms on their computers and VR (virtual reality) headsets.

London 19th-20th & 26th-27th September - Year 6

Starting with an early meeting at Bridlington Railway Station, groups of our Year 6 pupils headed down on the train to Kings Cross, via Hull, to begin their London 'Kip on a Ship' adventure. After negotiating the underground, we arrived at the HMS Belfast: our sleeping quarters for the night. We dropped off our bags, ate a quick lunch and headed out again to see a musical (Matilda for the first group; Lion King for the second). Both shows were an incredible spectacle to see. We then headed back to the ship for tea, activities on the ship and finally to bed (although we were all shattered, some took a while to settle, but we all slept well in the end).

We awoke early the next day to pack our bags, eat breakfast on the ship (the toast was good) and head out for our second day. We passed by Buckingham Palace on our way to the boat trip (we didn't see the King on this occasion), starting from near the Houses of Parliament. A tour guide told us all about the buildings we saw on the trip, including which was the true London Bridge. We then headed back to Tower Bridge to visit the Tower of London and learn about its history and the people who were kept there (and who didn't make it out again!)

Then we travelled back to the boat to collect our belongings, took the Tube back to Kings Cross, ate a Mc Donald's and caught the trains back to Bridlington. Thank you so much to our teachers and to Alan and the other volunteers who made this trip to London possible.

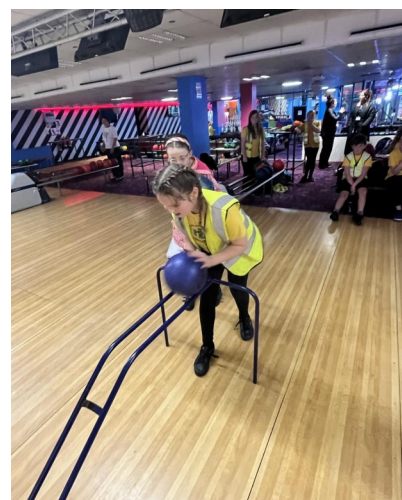

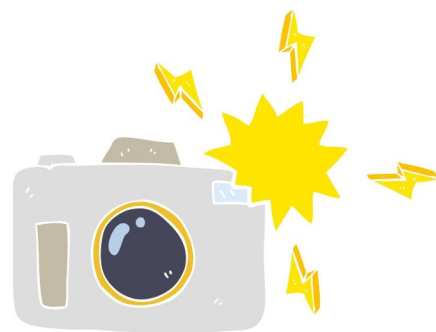


School Photographs
