treated to a hands on workshop. Mohammad, Adam and Joey shared the importance of flares within their field of work, instructing the children in how to make their own flare rocket out of paper. Then, it was time to test them! Using compressed air, we fired our rockets into the sky, discussing how the higher the altitude reached, the greater chance of rescue arriving for those stranded or in need of help.

It was a fantastic treat to hear all the ways our armed forces can help us.
