


The Doll Twin

but it's a fantastic child-friendly horror story, in which two unlikely friends face down their worst fears in order to stop their small town - and themselves - from disappearing.



Loki, a Bad God's Guide to Making Enemies (book 4)




I really, really loved Loki, I want to read the second one! I just loved all of Loki, it was so good! - Ivy


Burlington Pupils Recommend...
