In the news this week

This year, Anti-Bullying Week takes place on 11th-15th November with the theme, 'Choose Respect'. As part of the week, Odd Socks Day is on Tuesday 12th November, with odd socks being worn to celebrate what makes us all unique. There are many other ways schools are raising awareness and taking action to tackle bullying, including several pupils working towards becoming Anti-Bullying Ambassadors.

Share your thoughts and read the opinions of others

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Ambassador – A person who represents and promotes a group, cause or values to others. What difference do you think having ambassadors could make in school?

Culture – The shared attitudes, values, and practices within a group, like a school or organisation. An Anti-Bullying Ambassador is someone whose role is to promote a culture of celebrating and tolerating differences.

Diffuse – To calm down and reduce tension in a tense situation. We learned how to diffuse difficult situations.

Social action – Steps or efforts taken by individuals or groups to create positive change in society. Social action planning, with ideas and next steps to launch a whole-school anti bullying campaign.

Tackle – To actively work on solving or reducing a problem. Can you think of any ideas to help prevent or tackle bullying?

Upstander – Someone who sees wrong or harmful behaviour and chooses to take action to help stop it or support the person affected. Antonym: bystander.

There were 10 teams in the competition and every team played against each other once in games that lasted 7 minutes.

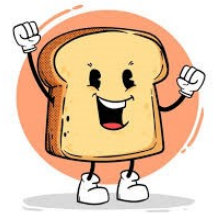


Both Burlington teams did brilliantly. Burlington 2 won 5 games, drew 1 and lost 3. Burlington 1 won every game.

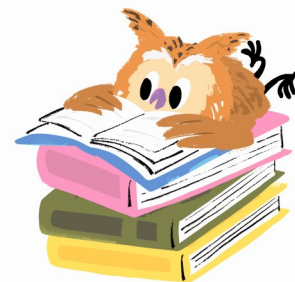
Stay & Read - Year 3 + 4

The Local Authority has asked us to share the below notice with you Is your child too ill for school?

Please share this message in your parent/carer newsletters.

Worried if your child is well enough for school/nursery?

If you are feeling overwhelmed by colds, coughs and rashes, [this simple NHS webpage](#) has some great tips and information to help parents and carers make the right choice throughout the winter months.

It also explains the national guidelines schools and nurseries have to follow to keep settings safe and well.

Top simple tips to remember and share with parents and carers:

- If your child has a high temperature, keep them off school/nursery until it goes away.
Children with diarrhoea or vomiting should stay away from school/nursery until they have not been sick or had diarrhoea for at least two days (48 hours).

Don't forget to wash hands with soap and warm water to keep viruses and stomach bugs away!

Please note many infectious diseases and all incidents of diarrhoea and vomiting are reported daily to the local authority. This ensure that both the school and the council can monitor the number of cases in the school.
