
<u>Science at Headlands - Year 6</u>

On Tuesday, Year 6 visited Headlands for a STEM (Science, Technology. Engineering and Maths) morning. They learnt how to operate bunsen burners safely and then use these to test metal solutions in the flames to find out what colours they burnt with. This linked to how fireworks are made. They also worked in teams in the woodworking department to develop and create a catapult, using measuring and cutting tools to make these. They were on a time limit and finished just in time to test them and catapult a rubber across the classroom. It was a fun morning experiencing practical STEM tasks.









Being safe & following the law

On Friday, the Year 6 spent a day discussing and learning about being safe and following the law. Over a series of 5 workshops, they learnt about how the law applies to them; law, the criminal justice system and life in a prison (Prison Me No Way); rail safety (Network Rail); road safety (East Riding Council); and how to be safe online. The workshops were very valuable, the presenters were vey engaging and made it very clear how the law applied and how it was designed to keep them and others safe.
